

Child Care Immunization Report: Vaccine Doses Guide

Minimum Immunization Requirements for Child Care in Minnesota

- Use this chart and the reporting worksheets to help complete the Child Care Immunization Report.
- Find the child's age, and see if the child had the number of shots shown by the check marks under each vaccine.
- This chart shows the vaccines and doses required to enroll in child care, but it is not the complete childhood immunization schedule. - Rotavirus and flu vaccines are not required but are highly recommended for all infants and young children.

① If the child has already had chickenpox disease, varicella vaccine is not required. The child's doctor must sign a form.

② Child must have one dose by age 24 months when enrolled in child care. New enrollees 24 months or older must have one dose at time of enrollment.

Exemptions To enroll in child care in Minnesota, children must show they've had these immunizations or file a legal exemption.

Parents may file a medical exemption signed by a health care provider or a non-medical exemption signed by a parent/guardian and notarized.
